

The expectation of summer reading is that you have finished reading the novel by the start of school on August 17th. The lessons and assessments that we do during the first three weeks will all be related to this text and there will not be class time given to complete the reading. ### **HELPFUL ANNOTATION GUIDE:**

The Harvard College Library has posted an excellent guide to annotation, "<u>Interrogating Texts: Six</u> <u>Reading Habits to Develop in Your First Year at Harvard.</u>" Just remember that highlighting complements annotating, but highlighting by itself does not count as annotating. Pay attention to literary devices/elements you've already studied in the past and be able to explain *how* they are used to create meaning rather than just identifying them.

### WHAT TO EXPECT THE FIRST WEEKS OF SCHOOL:

 $\cdot$  You will discuss the novel on the first day of class.

 $\cdot$  You will have a short answer response test in which you will be required to analyze three (3) specific passages using close reading strategies on the second day of class.

 $\cdot$  You will be analyzing a specific theme of the novel in a group project/presentation during the first two weeks of class.

 $\cdot$  You will be discussing all of the essential questions at length in a student-led Harkness discussion during the first two weeks of class.
