#### **Course Information**

AP Human Geography is not a traditional geography class. Instead of learning about the locations of physical and political features, this course focuses on the interactions between humans and their environment and between human populations.

Emphasis is placed on class discussion, the use of primary and secondary sources, critical reading, and analytical writing. This course prepares students to take the College Board Advanced Placement Human Geography examination and possibly earning college credit.

As per the AP policy at AHN: any student not holding a grade of 75 at mid-year will be removed from the course; no exceptions.

#### **Accountability and Independent Learning**

You are responsible for reading and studying the textbook as well as ALL other readings. There will be a schedule located on Veracross at the beginning of each semester. While most of the textbook and course readings will be discussed in detail through our class discussions and seminars some of it will be covered through independent learning. You are responsible for *ALL MATERIAL ASSIGNED*, whether we discussed it in class or not

#### The four Bs for success in APHuG

- Be ready for classroom discussion; be an active learner every class!
- Be open to analysis and interpretation (this class is not always black-and-white and memorizing facts).
- Be open to asking for help! For some of you this is your first AP class so remember that help is not a four letter word

#### **Assignment**

As a prerequisite to the course, AP Human Geography students are expected to enter class with a basic understanding of the physical and political geography of the world - the locations of the continents and oceans, the arrangement of regions, and the locations of certain countries found within each of these regions. To ensure students are adequately prepared for geographic requirements (which is most often included as part of a middle school geography course), students are tasked, as their summer assignment for AP Human Geography, with being able to identify the locations of a series of physical and political arrangements in our world along with introductory vocabulary and introducing course themes

For this assignment you may print out the document and fill it in by hand or complete it on your iPad using the Notability app.

Due Date: First day of class. No late work will be accepted. This will count as TWO formative grades. It will be graded for correctness, NOT completeness.


You will be given two formative assessments on your summer assignment within the first two weeks of school.


